When: Saturday, **April 24, 2010, 8 AM - 12 PM**

Where: High School Rear Parking Lot, **Enter from Sohler Rd.**

Who: Beverly Residents Only, **No Commercial Waste (proof of residency required)**

COSTS: \$20.00 Co-Pay - Cash Only

CAR TIRES: \$2.00/ea 16" or less

What Do I Bring?

From the HOUSE:

drain cleaners
oven cleaners
furniture polish
photo chemicals
floor cleaners
dry cleaning fluid
hobby and art supplies
mercury waste (fluorescent bulbs, thermostats, thermometers)

From the GARAGE:

automobile antifreeze
brake fluid
wax polish
engine or radiator flushes
transmission fluid
car batteries
fuels, gasoline, kerosene

From the YARD:

pesticides
herbicides
rodent killers
insect spray
pool chemicals
muriatic acid
no-pest strips
cesspool cleaners
propane tanks, no helium tanks

From the WORKBENCH:

rust preventers
wood preservatives
wood strippers
oil-based paint, stain, etc
paint thinners
solvents
degreasers
sealants
creosote

What Not to Bring!!

- **TV's, monitors, electronics (Electronics Collection Event 5/22/10)**
- **motor oil (take to DPS- Park St)**
- **latex paint & driveway sealer (pop lids, let dry and throw away)**
- **smoke detectors, fire extinguishers**
- **compressed gas cylinders**
- **ammunition, fireworks, explosives**
- **prescription medicine (Medication Take Back Prq 4/24/10 @ Senior Center 9-11 am)**
- **syringes (drop off at Beverly Hospital Main Entrance, Sharps Kiosk)**
- **commercial or industrial waste**
- **infectious biological waste, radioactive waste**
- **asbestos**

How Can I safely transport these hazardous materials?

- △ Leave materials in original container
- △ Tighten caps and lids. Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper. Do not place in a garbage bag
- △ Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners
- △ NEVER MIX CHEMICALS – Never Smoke
- △ Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site
